Tip 1: Don't be afraid to communicate with funders

Funders, contrary to popular belief, want to hear from you. Frame the conversation around understanding their goals. This will help save everyone time by confirming your eligibility, funder interest, etc.

Tip 2: Customize your grant applications

Mass mailing of cookie-cutter proposals is a sure way to guarantee a refusal. To customize your grant application be sure to read application instructions very carefully because each funder will have different requirements and guidelines.

Tip 1: Do not assume. Always contact the funder with any questions or concerns prior to submitting the application. We always love to hear from grantees about the project you are working on. We are here to help and give advice.
